

Miles Turnbull is an Associate Professor in the Faculty of Education at the University of Prince Edward Island. He is Coordinator of Graduate Programs and works in the pre-service program in French second language teaching, as Coordinator of the Bachelor of Education- French Immersion. Before joining the faculty at UPEI, Miles was an Assistant Professor in the Modern Language Centre at OISE-UT and he worked in core and immersion French programs in three Canadian provinces. His research interests include French as a second language (core and immersion), code switching, teacher development, teacher belief systems, project-based and experiential learning, as well as educational technology. Miles is currently Past-President of the Canadian Association of Second Language Teachers.

Miles' curriculum vitae includes a list of publications including co-edited books, co-edited issue of academic journals, chapters in academic books, refereed and non-refereed articles, book reviews, articles in published conference proceedings and several technical reports. He is particularly excited about a forthcoming co-edited book with *Multilingual Matters - First language use in second and foreign language learning: The intersection of theory, practice, curriculum and policy*. Miles is also proud of a co-authored professional reference text published in 2007 by Pearson Education – *Making connections: Effective literacy practices in FSL*.

Miles has also presented dozens of academic papers at refereed national and international conferences. He has been invited to do plenary and keynote presentations, in both of Canada's official languages, in almost every Canadian province, in parts of the United States and abroad. He has also delivered a gazillion workshops at professional teachers' conferences and professional development events.

Miles' research has been funded by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, Canadian Heritage, The Education and Quality Assurance Office of Ontario, and the Canadian Association of Second Language Teachers. In 2006, Miles was awarded the prestigious research scholar in residence in official languages award funded by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada and the Department of Canadian Heritage.
